



## PLANO ROAD CORRIDOR STUDY | PUBLIC MEETING #1 – May 9, 2017

### What are Activity Nodes?

As part of the process, the study team identified “activity nodes” along the Plano Road Corridor. These activity nodes are areas of existing or potential commercial or social interaction and are usually located in the environs of major road intersections. Four activity nodes were initially identified along the Plano Road corridor. The most mature of these nodes is the established Plano Village Center located at the intersection of Plano Road and Larmon Mill Road and includes a few commercial establishments, the volunteer fire department, the community park, a few churches, and the Plano Elementary School. The next most established node is at the intersection of Plano Road and Scottsville Road which has some longstanding businesses, and a recent constructed commercial center. The node that is currently experiencing new development and has the potential for even more development is centered upon the new interchange of Plano Road with the Natcher Parkway. The fourth and less active node has been identified at the multiple intersections of KY 240 and KY 242 with Plano Road located on the southern end of the study corridor. During this initial community engagement of the planning process, the public is being asked to provide their level of concern with these four nodes as to future development or redevelopment and to provide their preferences for the type of development or redevelopment to be located along the corridor.
