### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Staff member Karissa Lemon called the meeting to order.

### 2. REVIEW/ACCEPT SUMMARY NOTES – June 14, 2021

There were no additions or corrections to the summary notes from the June 14, 2021 BPAC meeting.

### 3. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments.

### 4. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS & PROJECT UPDATES

Mr. Nick Cook reported that the City's West End Greenway project is still under property negotiations, with all offers made on properties. The City recently received additional funds to complete the ADA sidewalk improvement project along state-maintained roadways. The bid was awarded and work will start soon. A new TAP grant cycle recently opened. Mr. Cook stated the City will be applying for two projects: a greenway extension from the Creekwood Greenway to connect to the Veterans Memorial Greenway and for improvements to the College Street pedestrian bridge.

WKU reported that students are beginning to move back to campus with the semester beginning August 23. They are continuing to explore bike-share opportunities in partnership with the City, but there are currently no updates.

Mr. Josh Moore reported that the County has received complaints about the South Warren Greenway trail being used for parking near the baseball fields. They are looking into this issue to prevent trail blockage.

Ms. Lemon also announced several upcoming activities: community bike rides on the fourth Saturdays of each month through October, Bike Social at Preston Miller Park on August 19, and a block party at Pedigo Park on September 8.

### 5. NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Lemon introduced the first item of new business related to the Bike/Ped Master Plan update. She stated that staff have been meeting to discuss revising the terminology of the bicycle and pedestrian facilities in Warren County to more accurately describe the facility. Ms. Lemon explained the differences between the proposed terminologies: shareways, bikeways, and walking paths. All were in favor of the modifications.

Ms. Lemon presented the proposed Loop route, which encircles the City connecting existing greenways and filling in gaps. The Loop will be a priority for future grants and will shape the interconnectivity of other bike/ped projects. Dr. Tougas suggested adding the use of sharrows to the map to connect neighborhoods to the Loop.

### 6. ADJOURN

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting will be held on October 11, 2021.
